FROM THE PASTOR

I was recently reminded of the song "I Wonder as I Wander." The full lyrics matter less to me than the title itself, because my concern at this point is with both wondering and wandering.

You've heard some of my meanderings about *wonder* before, but Advent and Christmastide always bring these twin practices – wondering and wandering – back to the forefront of my thoughts. Each year, as I arrive at Christmas Eve, I find myself wondering about the wandering we – church folks and pastors alike – have been doing since the first Sunday of Advent. I also wonder about those beyond our church who have been wandering through these weeks as well.

Perhaps we have all wandered around the birth of Jesus in different ways – some treating it as a holiday, some as a holy day, and most of us as some mixture of the two.

And that makes me wonder: have we actually wondered at all as we wandered through these weeks? Have we been too busy to wonder – or even to wander? Will we continue to wonder as we wander into the aftermath of Christmas, through the twelve days of Christmas into Epiphany? Or will we simply thank God it's over and rush back to our normal, predictable lives?

You can't make people wonder or wander. That realization causes me to reflect: Was there something in these past weeks I passed by too quickly – something I should have wondered about as I wandered? It also invites me to think about how I might wander more attentively in the days ahead, and how I might allow wonder to find me there.

I once heard someone say that when all is said and done, God's only question will be, "Did you enjoy it?" I know this much: I enjoy life most when I am filled with wonder. When I wonder as I wander, life feels richer. And even when I simply wander, I often stumble into wonder.

So on Christmas Eve, I will sit before the final lights of the Advent wreath and wonder. On Christmas morning, I will light a fire, turn on the tree lights, and sit in the quiet to wonder once more.

One thing I continue to wonder about is our resistance to wandering. Everything in our lives feels driven – planned, prescribed, directed, intentional. Wandering almost feels like a sin. Who has time for it? What happens if we stray from the prescribed path and get lost? Those fears may be justified on a hiking trail, but they often keep us from wandering into moments of beauty and grace. We are almost programmed *not* to wander. GPS guides our every move, and time feels too precious to "waste" on aimless exploration.

And so my prayer this Christmas is simple: that you and I – and many others – might dare to wander, and wonder as we wander.
