However, the preacher had handled more than one offering bag. Seasoned as he was, when handed the bags he checked them out. Then he took time to clean his glasses and to look into the bag a second time.

He cleared his throat and announced with the little enthusiasm he could muster, "Our mission to invite the poor to join our congregation has been an outstanding success. I can assure you they are all here."

I never receive FBC's monthly financial reports with the disheartened reaction that minister once had to his offering bag on Sunday morning. Instead, I am consistently grateful and encouraged by the remarkable generosity of this congregation. Your faithful tithes and offerings continue to inspire both gratitude and hope. I would be remiss if I did not express my sincere thanks for your giving.

Your generosity enables the wide range of ministries and missions we carry out in this community and beyond. It also makes possible the service of our full-time and part-time ministers who live, serve, and lead here in Eatonton.

I have long believed that the entire church budget is, in truth, a *mission budget*. While one section may be labeled "missions," every dollar supports our larger purpose—to lead people to worship God, teach the Bible, follow Jesus, and love others. "BE THOU MY VISION"

Dear Church Family,

As we sing "Be Thou My Vision" in worship this Sunday, I wanted to share some thoughts about this beautiful hymn that has strengthened believers for generations.

This ancient prayer song originated in Ireland, likely composed in the 6th or 7th century. The original Gaelic poem, attributed to Saint Dállan Forgaill, was translated into English in the early 20th century by Mary Elizabeth Byrne and later versified by Eleanor Hull. The haunting Irish folk melody we know today, called SLANE, gives the text its distinctive character and has made this hymn a favorite across denominations.

What makes this hymn so enduring is its intimate plea for God's presence to infiltrate every aspect of our lives. Rather than asking for material blessings or specific outcomes, the writer seeks something far more profound: for God Himself to become our primary focus and guide. Each verse builds on this theme, asking the Lord to be our wisdom, our true Word, our shield, and our inheritance.

The hymn reminds us that our spiritual journey isn't about acquiring more knowledge about God, but about cultivating a relationship where He becomes our vision—our way of seeing everything else. When we sing this hymn, we're praying that God would so fill our hearts and minds that His perspective becomes our own.



Dear Friends of First Baptist Eatonton,


