FROM THE PASTOR

He liked to drive fast, too fast. He found himself with three tickets in one year, a personal record. And he found himself mandated to one of those driving classes for such offenders who wished to keep their driver's license. He wasn't quite sure what to expect. He surely wasn't expecting a teacher who would ask him such a question. "Why are you here?"

He tried the simple answer. "Because I got three speeding tickets."

"No, really, why are you here?" Was this simple driving instructor asking him what he learned in seminary was an existential question. As you might have suspected the student was a pastor. He wasn't sure how to answer.

The questions continued. "Where are you going in such a hurry?"

Pastor Mike said, "Well, the first time I was going to . . ."

The instructor interrupted, "No, where are you going in such a hurry?"

Was the instructor asking another existential question?

And before he could decide how to answer, the instructor continued again, "Life is short. Take your time and enjoy it." The student knew a sermon when he saw one.

The instructor quipped once again, "There is just a grave waiting for you down that road."

And then Pastor Mike heard the instructor ask, "What are you looking for?"

Now that struck a chord! He had preached on it. He asked himself, "What was I looking for in life that caused me to move so frantically through the world?"

He reflected on all these things as he wrote his reflection for *The Christian Century* on that very question from the Gospel text, John 1:29-42.

Indeed, what a question, maybe *the* question.

He continued to write, "When someone shows up in church for the first time, what are they looking for? Direction? Meaning? Hope? Something spiritual? Will they find it? When an unchurched couple asks to be married in the church, what are they looking for? A reminder of the sacred? A blessing for a long journey? To start out on the right foot? When someone is trying to decide on a job change or a career change, what are they looking for?

In John's Gospel, Jesus always shifts from small talk to the deeper questions. ...

What are you looking for in life? Indeed, what makes life worth living? We audaciously claim that it's about relationships, with God and one another. Love of God and love of neighbor. When we come to the end of our earthly journey, there are few if any possessions that we will say made life worth living. It will be the relationships: the love we gave and received. ... Like the disciples in John 1, perhaps we hope following Christ might keep us focused on what matters."

The gracious invitation from Jesus is to "come and see." Come and see what he teaches about relationships, love and meaning, among other things. Explore with him such existential questions like, "Why do we barrel through life at such speeds or have such obsessions?"


