FROM THE PASTOR

I'm not sure if anyone heard it besides me. And it has been a long time since I've climbed a good tree. Nevertheless, the comment sounded like good theology. Ms. Cindy was leading the children's sermon about Zacchaeus when she summarized with some final statements, among which was the statement, "... so if you can't see Jesus, climb a tree and you will." That may not be exactly what she said. I know in leading my share of children's sermons I've had no recollection sometimes of saying the things people say they heard me say. Regardless, I like the line. "If you can't see Jesus, climb a tree and you will."

As I said earlier, I haven't climbed a tree in a long time. When I walk, my walking path takes me past a deer stand someone tied to a tree where I regularly see deer. But I haven't taken time to climb up to the platform. After hearing too many deer hunters' 'I've fallen and can't get up' stories, I'm a little hesitant to risk such a climb.

However, I recall as a boy loving to climb this one magnolia tree that grew deep in the woods on the family farm. After walking around in the woods hunting for almost anything to shoot and finding nothing, I found myself climbing a huge magnolia tree. This particular magnolia had limbs to the ground so it was an easy approach. The limbs grew close enough together it was almost like climbing a circular staircase. When I got to the top, I gasped at the view and the breath-taking, swaying motion. I still recall being so far above the ground and gasping for breath as the tree top blew in the wind. But I didn't connect it to Jesus until Ms. Cindy in church worship connected it for me. There I was, held in the arms of a gracious Savior above all things, swaying in the wind. I tell myself it is still true, even when it feels like something else is happening. I think of climbing that tree and seeing Jesus. Thank you, Ms. Cindy, for telling me that's what was happening!

I'm tempted to climb a tree real soon. And if I find the right tree, I'm pretty sure I will - to see Jesus, to be held. However it happens to you, I pray upon you the blessing of being held in the arms of a gracious Savior above all things, swaying in the wind.


