FROM THE PASTOR

I read from a variety of devotional resources each week. Some of it is worth repeating just as it is. Here is one of those resources from this week's reading. It's about the stories that we allow to shape us, frame our views. We'd all like to think the Biblical story is our framing story. But it is so easy for other stories to subtly become our framing story. Take a look at it this way as told by these two authors.

Brian McLaren writes: A framing story gives people direction, values, vision, and inspiration by providing a framework for their lives.... If it tells us that the purpose of life is for individuals or nations to accumulate an abundance of possessions and to experience the maximum amount of pleasure during the maximum number of minutes of our short lives, then we will have little reason to manage our consumption. If our framing story tells us that we are in life-and-death competition with each other ... then we will have little reason to seek reconciliation and collaboration and nonviolent resolutions to our conflicts....

But if our framing story tells us that we are free and responsible creatures in a creation made by a good, wise, and loving God, and that our Creator wants us to pursue virtue, collaboration, peace, and mutual care for one another and all living creatures, and that our lives can have profound meaning ... then our society will take a radically different direction, and our world will become a very different place.

Father Richard Rohr piggy backs off McLaren's comments to say: When we believe in a deep way that life is good, God is good, and humanity is good, we do exciting and imaginative things because we are confident that we are part of a storyline that is going somewhere good. As Christians, we have the opportunity to live the story given to us at the very beginning (Genesis 1), that creation is "good," even "very good," and that it is our vocation to nurture and grow such goodness wherever we can.

I hope this emphasis on starting with "good," "very good" becomes an epiphany for you. It's like the coach who leads her comments with the strengths of the player and moves finally to the places the player can yet be strengthened. It is a good world God has created and good things God continues to create. May we be a strength to that good story.

God instructs us to love one another, His most important commandment to us all. What does it mean to love one another? It seems difficult, this act of offering love to all. In John 13:34, He said to us, "A new commandment I give to you, that you love one another: just as I have loved you, you also are to love one another."

Have you ever had a moment in your life where you tried to "look busy" to avoid having to help someone out or ignored a stranger who just kept talking to you as you waited in line together at the grocery store? *You're not alone*. It is human nature for us to remove ourselves from situations that are uncomfortable, but we are called to embrace the uncomfortable and really, truly love others well. God calls us to be brave and to share His love with all who cross our paths. Scripture states that we should "not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for by this some have entertained angels without knowing it." (Hebrews 13:2 NIV)

When it comes to loving others, there are many, many ways to do so, but to start, *pray for them*. Praying for others daily is an impactful way of loving them unconditionally, just as God calls us to do. Think about the people that are present in your everyday life and ways that you could pray for them. Think about the people that you come across every so often, maybe a relative that you haven't seen in years or a friend you've drifted away from. How can you love them and serve the Lord through prayer? If we are called to truly *love one another* - that means we must see past outer appearances, we must see past the little annoying behaviors of others, and we must see past the awkwardness of new situations. We must look past these things so that we can get to the hearts of those who are placed in our paths.

Is there someone in your life you're feeling God placing on your heart? Maybe you have two or three people in mind? Sit down today and say a prayer for them – however you feel called, and then send them an encouraging card today or invite them to lunch. And for those whom you happen upon in the grocery store or the coffee shop line, offer them an encouraging word and keep them in mind as you talk to God throughout your day. As we approach Valentine's Day, let us approach it and others with God's love. May we commit to loving one another each day as Christ has loved us.


