The following excerpt is from the "Medieval Church History" portion of a Church History class I have taken:

I want to give thanks for a God Who steadfastly refuses to give up on any of us—a God Who is forever and always at work for good: forming, reforming, and transforming the world, the church, and every human heart. I want to give thanks for the privilege of being called—along with all my sisters and brothers—to not be passive spectators but active participants in the craziness and the ongoing fight for peace in our personal relationships, our neighborhoods, and our world. I want to give thanks for the strength God graciously promises to us in these times of struggle. And I want to give thanks for a loving Church family and home, that seeks to be a place of peace and comfort for those who are hurting and lost. I give thanks to God for a Church that still offers the world a glimpse of people who keep humbly seeking to learn to live together in love.


