FROM THE PASTOR'S DESK

It's not a word that we use often. I'm cautious about speaking it publicly for fear of how it will be heard and what people might conclude it means. The word is epiphanic. It's a stronger word than enlightening, but it means something that is enlightening. It means revealing. It's like an aha moment. It's what you feel standing before a redwood tree for the first time, or atop Clingman's Dome. It's what you feel every time you arrive at the beach and let the waves cover your feet. Or it's what is revealed when a child gives you such a strong hug.

Something is epiphanic when epiphanies overwhelm you. Thus the season of church life into which we enter after Christmas is Epiphany. The birth of Christ has been an epiphanic moment, an epiphany.

The Wise Men signal the first seekers beyond the borders of the country to seek and find and pay homage to the newborn baby with gifts. Innocently enough, they were seeking the origin of the light. They were seeking an epiphany.

Epiphanies are not always openly apparent. Plenty can seek them and feel like they are never found. Others seem to experience them often.

I recall Mary Oliver's poem that concludes with the lines,

"... You wouldn't believe what once or twice I have seen. I'll just tell you this: only if there are angels in your head will you ever, possibly, see one."

The Wise Men had it in their head, a star. They were seeking, actively, innocently and even with uncertainty – but it all led to an epiphanic moment.

The beauty of this story is that God welcomes seekers and wishes to be found. God wishes to share epiphany after epiphany with all. Sometimes they are directly related to our seeking. Sometimes they are simply happenstance – but regardless the Gospel is epiphanic!

As we move forward through the days of Epiphany I trust you are alert to the stories of light that abound.
