FROM THE PASTOR

She has been practicing it for several years now – for over a decade. Her first lessons were on VHS tapes, so it has to be over a decade ago. She came to it before I did, and tried to drag me along. I should have listened. I was reluctant until other forces sent me off to the Ignatius House of Atlanta to practice forty-eight hours of silence. She tried to tell me more about it then, but I was stubbornly dismissive. And yes, there have been more than one person to say they cannot imagine me being silent for forty-eight hours. But that is not where I began, nor what I am suggesting you attempt.

It starts slow, in blips and pieces. For us it really started with her practices. I got into it by a different path, but cherish it just as much. Our practices are somewhat unique to each of us, but they achieve much the same.

What am I talking about? Centering Prayer. Catherine is the better practitioner of the two of us, though there really is no good, better, best practitioner. It follows a prayer practice many centuries old. It goes back beyond Jesus even. Jesus probably practiced it as he did because he had learned it in the synagogue, among his Jewish ancestry.

Catherine will be teaching two lessons on **Centering Prayer** and then I will continue some lessons during Lent. We will share with you some of our favorite sources, but of course ultimately it is simply a work of grace from the Spirit, passed down for centuries to any who chooses to practice.

Catherine describes the experience very simply:

"Centering Prayer is like holding hands with God or sitting in God's lap with our heads tucked in the crook of his neck or sitting with God on the porch swing and just rocking, in silence. There is no need for words, our presence is enough. God's presence is enough.

We sit in silence and open our hearts to God, commune with God.

There are many ways we can and do communicate with each other that do not require words; a grin, a wink, a burst of laughter, a tear, a hug, a kiss. We can communicate with God without words just by showing up, just by allowing our hearts and minds to be fully present. This is Centering Prayer."

Catherine invites you to gather with her on **Wednesday nights January 24 and 31 at 6:15 in the sanctuary** – "I will be sharing with you my experience with Centering Prayer and how this wonderful, silent prayer time can change, nurture and grow you into closer communion with God."

Who do you think you are? You might define your identity by the things people see on the surface—like your style, your look, your abilities, or your reputation. Those things might have something to do with who you are, but they don't quite capture the whole picture, do they? For each of us, there is always so much more to who we are beneath the surface. But who are we, really? How can we discover who God made us to be? And how can following Jesus shape who we're becoming? In this four-week series, we'll look at four moments from the early years of Jesus' life. As we do, we'll see how God's Word helps us discover who we're becoming and how God's words help us discover who we are. We'll also learn how the right relationships help us discover how to grow and how Jesus helps us discover purpose.

I invite you to use the following devotionals which follow the outlines of the lessons our Youth are using on Wednesday night.

Week 1: Luke 2:40-52; Proverbs 2:1-6; 2 Corinthians 10:5

-Take a moment to read and meditate on these passages this week. What stands out to you in these passages and why? **PRAY**: This week, ask God to help you discover who you are in Him.

GROW: Is there someone you can ask to share how they see God working in you? Do you need to have an honest conversation with God about your questions and your doubts? I challenge you to commit to a time throughout your week to do something that makes you feel connected to God.

Week 2: Mark 1:4-11; Psalm 139:13-18; Romans 12:3-8

-Take a moment to read and meditate on these passages this week. What stands out to you in these passages and why? **PRAY**: This week, ask God to continue to speak into your heart and guide you.

GROW: Do you need to commit to reading the Bible to discover more about yourself? Can you talk with someone about what God has been speaking to you?

MESSAGE IN SONG - I SURRENDER ALL

Philippians 3 includes a repeated exhortation to rejoice in the Lord, always. Then he rattles off a few of his impressive credentials, but not just to brag. Instead, he's setting up his point for this part of his letter. He says, "But whatever gain I had, I counted as loss for the sake of Christ. Indeed, I count everything as loss because of the surpassing worth of knowing Christ Jesus my Lord..."

Skipping a bit, he goes on. "But one thing I do: forgetting what lies behind and straining forward to what lies ahead, I press on toward the goal for the prize of the upward call of God in Christ Jesus." This is a good lesson for us in the early days of 2024.

God has given each of us unique gifts, talents, training, experience, creativity, and the energy to use these in His kingdom. That's good, but we cannot afford to focus on who we are. We must surrender ourselves fully, all that we are or have, in order to focus on what lies ahead of us in Jesus.

We're not the first to come to this realization. In 1896, an artist named Judson Van DeVenter said that for some time he had been struggling between developing his talents in the field of art or going into full-time evangelistic work. "At last, a pivotal hour in my life came, and I surrendered everything. A new day was ushered into my life. I became an evangelist, and discovered down deep in my soul a talent hitherto unknown to me. God had hidden a song in my heart, and touching a tender chord, He caused me to sing."


All to Jesus, I surrender; All to Him I freely give;
