A reading that came across my screen this week is from Will Willimon's God Turned Toward Us. Ponder it with me.

"Yahweh, God's self-designation – When God shows up to Moses, speaking as a burning bush that isn't consumed, it's been so long since anybody has worshipped the true and living God that we forgot God's name. "I Am Who I Am," replies God, or if you prefer, "I Will Be Who I Will Be." In the Hebrew text: YHWH. Tossing in vowels, Yahweh.

To call yourself "I Am" suggests that God's name is beyond naming. God will not be as we would have God to be but as God is. God will not be defined, named, and designated by us and thereby ordered around. God will be who God will be whether we like it or not. We can't call God whatever we please. As the angel orders Joseph, "You will call his name Jesus, the one who

saves," rather than, "Josh, the therapist" or "Manny the masseur."

Still, God loves us enough to give us God's name. In our times of privation, we need not incoherently mumble, "O great, incomprehensible, unknowable, impersonal some one who may or may not be out there somewhere." We have been entrusted with the proper name whereby we, even we, can call upon the name of the Lord. We are given the privilege of being on a first name basis with the Son of God, able to pray in Jesus' name, even to begin prayer with "Our Father." Abba. Paul names as "saved" anyone who calls the Lord by name."

What blessed goodness this is for humans!


implemented a new Curriculum for our Children on Wednesday Night called, Trackers of Faith. This Curriculum will be used in multiple ways with our Children; Wednesday nights, Children's Church, and also our Stepping Stones Pre-School students will be following this curriculum for the year.

Our Youth Ministry is back in full swing as well. Our theme for this year is John 3:30, 'He must become greater; I must become less." We will be learning what it means to live for Christ, and to let God become Greater and for us to become less or to decrease in our own selves. Our first few weeks we have taken a dive into Isaiah 43:18-19, "Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past. See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it? I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland." We have talked about how we do not have to carry around baggage and "junk" from our past, because Jesus is offering to us, through relationship with Him, to take those burdensome things away. We also have discussed and have seen how through Jesus working in us, we are able to be a "catalyst" and cause change in other people's lives. But, not all catalysts cause a positive change. The students were challenged to be a catalyst in someone's life, and to be a positive Christ-like change for them. Lastly, we looked at how God is bringing change and "making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland." We all have an opportunity through faith in Christ, to forget the former things and the "baggage" in our past and to be a part of what God is doing now. The question is this; will we run to Jesus and let Him work through us to be a positive change in people's lives? Or, will we hang onto our baggage, let it weigh us down, and watch from the sidelines as God is doing a NEW THING?

#### MINISTRY THROUGH MUSIC


