FROM THE PASTOR

Speaking of resurrection again, because just once a year is never enough. It seems to me we have to keep talking about it in order to live into it, as well as to actually embody it.

I've seen some amazing resurrections in my life time. So have you! I continue to be amazed humans manage to rise from some of the absolute worst human experiences. It is astounding! It is testimony to the powers of resurrection that exist among us. The creative powers of God, that created something out of nothing continues to inspire life, to raise what is dead back to life. Thanks be to God!

The resurrection of Christ is affirmation the cross is the way of life. Such cruciform thought sounds so contradictory. It is a paradox. It takes a leap of faith to believe the cruciform way of God.

Some of the worst possible things we can imagine have happened and will happen in life, but the daring grace of Christian faith is to believe God is always a resurrecting power, operative in everyone's life. Such resurrection bears testimony to a loving, forgiving, redeeming, courageous God abounds among us. And the cruciform way is Jesus is the way God chose, and chooses to be present.

I confess I struggle to believe such resurrecting powers at times, especially in the midst of the worst. I've seen more than one parent survive, and rise from the death of a child. But I've always said I don't think I can do that. A dear friend promised me that in the face of such tragedy he believed I would somehow rise. I guess that's a friend believing for you when you cannot believe for yourself. We need such friends lest we succumb to the powers of death.

Thus we need one another for Easter. Perhaps the wisdom of gathering together as the Bible teaches us, is to gather into the collective faith of one another. Because faith is a group effort, more so at some times than others. Sometimes you carry the torch and sometimes I carry the torch. But all in all, we both believe because we have one another bearing faith with each other.

I wonder if the believers who remained after the crucifixion would have risen as they did, had it not been for one another. Women and men alike questioned, struggled and doubted. But they also held one another, bore testimony and met the resurrected Jesus together! And they themselves were raised back to faith, hope, love, courage, ...

What a gracious God to resurrect, love, forgive, empower, hope ... the world with creative powers! What joy God is so kind, and so foolish, as to keep covenanting with us! What resurrection is yet to be known? Only time will reveal such to us, but in time God will forever be present raising us to courageous, beautiful lives!

As Wendell Berry's poem, April Woods: Morning, says,

Birth of color out of night and the ground. Luminous the gatherings of bloodroot newly risen, green leaf, white flower in the sun, the dark grown absent.

EASTER SUNDAY IS ONLY THE BEGINNING!

Easter Sunday is only the beginning!

A great fifty-day feast (known as "Eastertide," "Easter Season," or "Easter Time," as well as "Paschaltide," "Paschal Season," or "Paschal Time") kicks off on Easter Day. In the Church Year, this is quite literally fifty days of feasting!

Easter is the highpoint of the Church Year. So, it makes sense that we would celebrate for so long. After all, the main point of the whole gospel is to prepare us for an eternal celebration and feast. This is reflected in the fact that our Lenten fast only lasts forty days (not including Sundays), while Easter is fifty days. Fasting will pass away, as Jesus said, but the Great Feast of the Lamb will last for "ages of ages", or as we say, eternity!

So let the feasting begin!

After the resurrection, Jesus spent forty days on earth before he ascended, and then there were ten more days after that before the Day of Pentecost. Luke writes in the first chapter of Acts that Jesus "presented himself alive to them after his suffering by many proofs, appearing to them during forty days and speaking about the kingdom of God." In chapter two, we find the followers of Jesus gathered for the Day of Pentecost, which means "fifty." It happened during the Hebrew feast of *Shavuot*, which is why the followers of Jesus were gathering. The Hebrew festival was originally a harvest first fruits celebration, and later it had evolved into a commemoration of the giving of the Law to Moses on Mt. Sinai.

So, the Great Fifty Days are a celebration of the Resurrection of Christ and all that means for us, leading to the launching of the Christian Church and its mission on Pentecost.

The Lectionary readings, during the following Sundays of Easter explore the post-resurrection appearances of Christ, and the promise of a future resurrection. We go back to a closed room in which Jesus suddenly appears...but Thomas isn't there. He doubts. Jesus later appears to him. Poor Thomas, forever cast as "doubting" even though his doubts were a helpful thing that eventually led him to worship Jesus and say, "My Lord, and My God." Then we have breakfast with Jesus and Peter. Peter had denied Jesus three times and, after the Resurrection, had returned to fishing. Jesus restores him and gives him a mission: "Feed my Sheep" and "Follow me."

We revisit Jesus' teaching on himself and his mission as well. He is preparing his disciples, and us, to take the power of his Resurrection to the world.

Ascension Day falls on the 40th day, which always falls on a Thursday. Because this is a weekday, some churches observe or focus on the Ascension that following Sunday, the Seventh Sunday of Easter. In this we hear Jesus give us the Great Commission, our true Mission Statement.


