### FROM THE PASTOR

I've seen him do it numerous times. Sensitized to hearing by the absence of eyesight, he listens to the preacher. Or the lecturer. Or the group of people who share with him what's been happening in their lives. Then he responds with a song as he plays the piano. He makes it up on the spot with his gift of voice, piano and hearing. You want to preserve it to play it later, but it is not recorded or written down. Just in that moment you receive the rich gift of Ken Medema's responsive gift of music and word.

One of them was recorded. In a session with the preacher, pastor and author Walter Wangerin, Jr. It was recorded by an old program going back to 1908 known as the Chicago Sunday Evening Club. I'll share more of it with you this Sunday. This is sort of a teaser.

Medema set things up for Wangerin with somber piece of music and the words,

Night was oh so long;
Light is a long time coming.

Now we take a sad, sad journey.

What will the day bring?

What song shall we be singing,

As we take this long, long journey to the tomb?

Then Wangerin shared the story of that first Easter morning with the resources of all the Gospel stories. He ended it with Mary Magdalene's encounter with Jesus, from the Gospel of John. Mary returned to the disciples once again and blurts out to Simon Peter and the others, "I have seen the Lord."

Medema is left to respond and he does so with something close to dance music on the keyboard as he sings,

Oh, dance, Simon, dance;

Hug me and hold me, spin me around and dance.

Now the night is gone away;

Did you ever see such a beautiful day?

Dance, dance, dance, Simon, dance.

You'll hear more of it Sunday as we lead ourselves to dance in the light of the resurrection. We've seen the Lord!

Many spoke of how the music's grand, ascending melody perfectly captures the feeling of resurrection—rising from death to life. Others mentioned how the text helps them envision Christ in His heavenly glory, reminding us that our worship here on earth joins with the eternal worship of heaven.

As we prepare our hearts for Easter, I invite you to reflect on how we might "crown Him" in our daily lives. How can we acknowledge Christ's lordship through our actions and attitudes? How can we live as resurrection people all year long?
