FROM THE PASTOR

My barber always asks me as I sit down in his chair, "How are you doing?" Today, he asked me how I do Christmas. How do I do Christmas? When I paused he explained he was wondering if Christmas is a really big kind of celebration or does it just come and go in some sort of regular pattern. And then when I still didn't answer, because I was still formulating an answer, he went on to tell me about a special gift he was especially excited about. I'll not tell you the details lest his surprise get out, but he is giving one of those 'half-dozen in a life-time kind of gifts' this year to someone very special. I look forward to the next hair cut to see how it turned out.

I finally found my space to answer his question. I confessed to him I make Christmas hard on myself as a preacher. My comment left me musing all afternoon until now. I feel like I hold these great jewels in my hands – all the trappings of Holy Scripture, Holy Child, Holy Mother, Holy Angels, Holy Shepherds, ... And it's my job to display them once again in a way that people will gasp, be enamored and be filled with wonder, joy and peace. Yet everyone has seen the jewels before. Many times. All that can be said about them has been said. They can hardly be displayed in any better way than they have already. Light has been shined upon them for over two thousand years. Words that somehow snap people awake to Christmas like never before!

Of course, it's an impossible task. It rises out of an egotistical heart to a great degree. To be the best. Say it the best. Like never before. To be the greatest of all time with my words! It will not happen. It need not happen.

The ancient text itself is the jewel. And what you do with jewels is just display them. You just fasten them around a neck, an arm, an ear ... And they shine and draw the eye. Before you know it, they garner someone's attention. Some say so. They compliment. They gasp. They sigh. Others just admire. You never know what they are thinking. You never know the impact made. And that's the beauty of a real jewel. It does a work of grace upon folks all by itself.

That's the beauty of a thing like Christmas. It's just a story, filled with a number of moving parts. Most are familiar with every piece of it. Occasionally, someone thinks they've found something novel, but rarely is their discovery so novel. It's mostly hidden knowledge they discover, but knowledge that's been around forever.

But again, that's OK. Christmas works a grace upon folks all by itself. And isn't that the blessing of it? The blessing of God, working works of grace upon folks in the Advent of Christ?

It will be so. It is the nature of God to do so. Thanks be to God!

YOUTH AND CHILDREN NEWS

We live in a restless world. The evidence is all around us. We hurry from one project and activity to another. We may wake up at six or seven in the morning only to be thinking about what we must do at work or what we must do to get the kids ready for school. Once work or school is over then it is off to soccer practice or dance lessons, stopping at McDonald's for a quick bite to eat in between. If we are retired, we often still find ourselves thinking of the next project we should be doing. Even when there is finally downtime in the evenings or the weekends, we may still feel restless and anxious. Rather than enjoying the quiet and truly resting, we may turn on the television or spend hours on our iPhones and iPads checking out Facebook, Pinterest, or YouTube... I may be confessing here a little... It seems that we always need to be doing something.

In his article, "God's Rest In A Restless World," Dr. Charles Arand attempts to diagnose the problem. He writes that our focus is too inward. We focus too much on ourselves, our activities, and our worries. He then points us to God's gift of Sabbath.

The Sabbath, as the Bible speaks of it, directs us to look past ourselves to the works of our God. If we do this, we truly receive rest that inspires and refreshes us. Then, we as created beings, receive the rest that our Creator has intended for us from the beginning of creation.

In Genesis 2 we read about God resting on the seventh day after he called his creation "very good." However, we read nothing about God's creatures resting on the seventh day. We find that in the Third Commandment in Exodus 20:8: "Remember the Sabbath day, to keep it holy."

Two reasons are given in the Scriptures for the Third Commandment. First, in Exodus 20:11 it says, "For in six days the Lord made the heavens and earth, the sea, and all that is in them, and rested on the seventh day. Therefore, the Lord blessed the Sabbath day and made it holy." It was important for the Creator and so it is important for his creatures. Second, Deuteronomy 5 places the Third Commandment in God's work of redeeming creation: "You shall remember that you were a slave in the land of Egypt, and the Lord your God brought you out from there with a mighty hand and an outstretched arm. Therefore, the Lord your God commanded you to keep the Sabbath day" (Dt. 5:15).

As Arand writes, "So the Sabbath is connected to the two great works of God: creation and the renewal of His creation. The one looked back to Eden, and the other looked forward to a new Eden, namely, the land of Canaan. Together they comprise God's epic story. Israel was to stop working, rest, and celebrate both of God's achievements. In the process, Israel would be refreshed, renewed, confident of God's provision".

God's works of creation and redemption in the Old Testament look forward to God's final renewal of creation accomplished in Christ. Through God's work in Christ, He gives us, His re-created and redeemed people, rest.

In our Sunday Morning Worship Services, God gives us rest in the work of Christ. Rest from our Sins. Renewal in the Spirit of God so that we are empowered and enabled to truly live as God's people in a restless world. No other rest that we create from our own hands will work. Only receiving and resting in the work of God's hands, our Creator truly works.

So, we continue to rest in God's work in Christ as he offers it in Word, Song, and Prayer in our Morning Worship Services each Sunday. Come this Advent Seasons, as God's child and rest in his Word and work for you. *In Christ*,


