It's an adventurous story. St. Patrick lived in the late fourth to mid fifth century. The best we know, he lived near the west coast of Britain, born the grandson of a priest, the son of a civil servant and deacon.

There is not space to tell all the details of life in such times, but it was a violent world to say the least. At the age of sixteen, the *Penguin Dictionary of Saints* says Patrick was carried off by raiders and enslaved in Ireland where he was used as a herdsman. During his time in Ireland, he began to take religion seriously and became a man of intense prayer. Who knows how much the religion of Ireland influenced his own experiences with the Christian faith in which he was formed. After six years he made his escape and returned by ship to the European continent. But soon he was compelled by a dream to return to those who held him captive to share Christ with them. Patrick was not the first to bring Christianity to Ireland, but he was among the first to spread the gospel to the north, the central parts, and the west. He brought organized church into existence in a vast way among the land and is said to have done so while cherishing the religious expressions already present. Thus, the term Celtic Christianity. The term speaks of a generous evangelism that respects and loves while also sharing the light of Christ.

It's a study in sociology and religion to study the history of how it turned out for the Church through the centuries till today. But St. Patrick's Day, celebrated March 17, is originally rooted in the celebration of God's grace, that lights the way through Christ for people to live joyfully. Christ in the eye that sees me,

Christ in the ear that hears me.
