FROM THE PASTOR

All the way from Barcelona, Spain, they'll be joining us for a special time of fellowship and sharing. I'm truly looking forward to their presentations and to the opportunity we'll have to be together again.

Also, most of you have heard by now that a new Pope was elected last week on May 8. While some Protestants may not see this as directly relevant, I believe it's a moment worth noting. The Pope holds one of the most visible and influential Christian pulpits in the world, and my hope is always that his voice will be one of blessing and challenge – a priestly and prophetic witness for all Christians.

His first words as Pope are already both a blessing and a challenge:

"Peace be with all of you!

Dearest brothers and sisters, this is the first greeting of the Risen Christ, the good shepherd who gave his life for God's flock.

I, too, would like this greeting of peace to enter your hearts, to reach your families, and all people, wherever they are, all of the people, all over the earth.

Peace be with you!

This is the peace of the Risen Christ, an unarmed peace and a disarming peace, humble and persevering. It comes from God, God who loves us all unconditionally. ...

God loves us, God loves you all, and evil will not prevail!

We are all in the hands of God.

Therefore, without fear, united hand in hand with God and among ourselves, we move forward. We are disciples of Christ.

Christ precedes us. The world needs his light. Humanity needs him as the bridge to allow it to be reached by God and by his love.

Help us, too, and help each other to build bridges, with dialogue, with meetings, uniting us all to be one people, always in peace. ..."

He concluded his remarks by saying to the Cardinals with whom he serves to lead the Church, his hopes they would "walk together, as a united Church always seeking peace, justice, always seeking to work as men and women who are faithful to Jesus Christ, without fear, to proclaim the Gospel, to be missionaries."

Most people know that, as a young priest, Pope Leo XIV served as a missionary in Peru. In my experience, once a missionary always a missionary – that calling shapes a person for life.

May we carry that same spirit of service alongside Pope Leo XIV, and with missionaries like Matt and Michelle, Trey and Kaitlyn, and so many others. Let us serve faithfully, wherever we are called.

ILLUMINATING HEARTS AND MINDS: REFLECTIONS ON "SEND THE LIGHT"

Written in 1890 by Gabriel, who would later become one of the most prolific gospel songwriters of his era, "Send the Light" emerged during a period of great missionary passion in American Christianity. The hymn perfectly captured the evangelical mindset of that time with its emphasis on spreading the gospel message. What makes this hymn particularly meaningful is its origin story. Gabriel reportedly composed it after attending a stirring missionary service where the call to global evangelism deeply moved him. The hymn's creation was an immediate response to that spiritual prompting-a musical expression of commitment to the Great Commission. From a musical perspective, "Send the Light" exemplifies effective hymnody through its accessible melody and memorable refrain. The tune moves with a marching quality that conveys purpose and determination, perfectly complementing its message of taking action to share faith.

As a music minister, I appreciate how Gabriel structured the piece with a simple yet powerful chorus that builds in emotional intensity. The rising melodic line in the refrain creates a natural crescendo that helps congregations express growing enthusiasm with each repetition. Though written over a century ago, this hymn's core message of sharing light with others remains deeply relevant. In our divided world, the metaphor of light-bearing speaks to our calling as Christians to bring hope, truth, and love to dark places-whether across oceans or across the street.

When teaching this hymn to younger generations, I emphasize its call to personal responsibility. The hymn reminds us that mission work isn't solely the domain of full-time missionaries; it's the responsibility of every believer to shine light in their sphere of influence. As we sing about sending the light, we're joining generations of believers who have found inspiration in these words. The hymn reminds us that our faith isn't meant to be contained but shared freely with a world in need.

In my experience, I've observed how this hymn often serves as a musical call to action—helping congregants move from passive worship to active service. Its enduring appeal lies not just in its memorable melody but in how it challenges us to live differently after the final notes fade. May we continue to find inspiration in hymns like "Send the Light," allowing their timeless messages to shape not just our worship but our daily witness as bearers of God's light in this world.
